When shaping the right side it's helpful to draw a diagonal line and keep your cuts to the right of the line marked "X"

Resolve these areas!









As a follow up to the actual cuts I like to lightly sand the surface to smooth it... (220 grit paper)





Front of the body block





Rounded over 👍





Layout of the scapular feather group...






Cut outside the line to a depth of 1/8" resolve it into the surrounding area and then lightly sand smooth...





Establishing the head direction





Remove the excess wood on either side...





The head block has been isolated. Note the position and importance of center lines!








Square up the back of the head...



Up to now, the only cutter I've used is the small serrated stump cutter..(known in the industry as the "Scholz Stump Cutter")



Make a profile pattern for the head and neck...



Refine each side of the head... then, remeasure and redraw the "T" mark at 1 3/4" from the base of the scapular.







Position the head profile pattern...
You have options and can have your little guy looking up or down...



Remove the waste wood (marked with the "x's")



Profile the head and re-draw the head center line





Layout lines for the wings ! (still just using the Stump cutter!)








Wings are shaped....!!







Round over the front region to the centerline...



Under tail coverts and tail dimensioning











DAY 2Tools used during our first day of carving.

We'll begin today by refining the head and bill. I'm still using the stump cutter... keep it simple!



Under tail coverts rounded over





Measure 2 7/8" up from end of the tail



Belly and tarsus lay-out



Still using the stump cutter...



Carve away in between the tarsus (legs)





These areas are now rounded over and now it's time to begin "blocking in" all the major feather groups...









Throat and breast area and sectioning the under tail coverts ... For these cuts we will be using a new cutter!







A ruby flame cutter works great for this! Run your tool as fast as it can go! Gesswein is 55,000 rpm





Initial cuts... lower the level below and round over










Adult Raven head profile. Note position of the eye... It's set lower in the head than one might think..



Front view



Reduce the upper part of the head block to 3/4" at the top slightly tapering to 5/8" then to 3/8" where the beak begins...



Top and front measurements...





The eye location is exactly 1 1/4" back from the tip of the beak





I've tapered in the cheeks and slightly rounded over the eye socket edges... Now I'm ready to round over the bill and then the top of the head above the eyes...



Tapered diamond cylinder cutter...



Round the bill first!



Looks like a Raven to me!







All set to set the eyes! A+B epoxy putty ... fill the sockets and place in the eyes... check for alignment and balance!










Once we create the eye lids... pay attention to the shape!

For comparison sake...

The left side has been contour sanded so you can see the difference in surface dynamic.









Once the overall contour sanding is complete, I lightly spray Isopropyl Alcohol 90% over the entire bird... video

Once the alcohol dries, I hand sand the body using 400 wet/dry paper wrapped around a soft silicon rubber cylinder...





The throat area is a place where we will have a "Feathering Field Day!" We're going to REALLY play up those throat feathers!!




Burning complete.... we'll talk legs, mounting and feet and where the body joins the leg tomorrow!





Leg rods...



Drill 1/8" diameter holes 1 1/8". Apart. I drilled 3/4" deep



This direction



These flank feathers are really shaggy!! A small 1/16" ball does the trick!





Progress of the lower flank feathering...

Sealer applied! Prior to sealing the bird, I used my airbrush with burnt umber and darkened the white area around the eye for tonal consistency

Do not gesso!

Begin with a 50% / 50% mix of these two (or something similar). You want a rich, deep purple with a hint of iridescence... Using a 1/2" oval wash brush, start by laying on a thin watery wash so it settles into the texturing!





First wash coat!






Second and third wash coats... just thin with water! No flow medium please!








This helps illustrate the concept I have for creating the illusion of black iridescence...





After the first 4 wash coats of the deep purple I "hopscotch " around the bird with highlights of this metallic green... you can see the subtle effect





Here is where the magic happens!
Mix 50 - 50 of these two... thin it down to airbrush consistency (like skim milk) And lightly airbrush the entire bird!!







My airbrush is just an Aztec "el cheapo" ! Shooting at about 27psi

DAY 10

Today Raveneers!! We will focus on the legs/ feet and putting it all together!




After establishing placement on the driftwood I drill two 5/16" holes about 1 3/8" apart... The cast toes are then bent to conform to the driftwood.

Then I carefully enlarge the hole found on each foot so the leg shaft passes through and position the leg.

Then, using 5-minute epoxy mixed with a pinch of "Morrissette's magic wood flour" I put a drop on the joint and allow it to settle in and harden. This locks it all together... but! Be careful not to glue the leg to the base!







After applying sealer to the feet. Painting is accomplished with a mid tone grey... Simply mix white gesso with the body color... (50% Ultramarine Blue 50% Burnt Umber)





Equal parts of 5 minute epoxy are mixed with just a dab of black paint...working quickly, glue the legs into the bird first... then at the same time, glue the leg shaft into the base... at long last... it's done!
